THE MAP OF MALAYSIA




FAST FACTS



Here, the extensive use of glass, coupled with the minimal use of pillars, maximize the flow of light and energy. While the sweeping floor to ceiling windows offer stunning views of the straits, and ample balconies function as elegant entertainment and viewing galleries.
